# **Background and Justification**

UNICEF received funds from Credit Institute for Reconstruction (Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau (KFW)) funds to support multisectoral activities. The project is titled "Multi Multi-sectoral Interventions to address vulnerabilities of conflict-affected displaced and host communities in Yemen". The overall objective is "to provide integrated WASH, Education and Protection support package and improve access to basic services of conflict-affected vulnerable populations, especially children whose needs are further exacerbated by the Ukraine crisis, to strengthen their resilience to further shocks.

In response, the education program is implementing the following activities:

- -Rehabilitation of 36 schools and provision of 20 modular classrooms to extend the capacity of existing schools
- -Provision of school equipment for 10,200 students and 400 teachers.

Children, particularly conflict-affected girls, and boys, in the governorates of Al Jawf, Hajjah, Al Mahweet, Marib, Taiz, and Sada'a are among the beneficiaries of these interventions. As part of construction activities, an assessment of school infrastructure is planned, including a school mapping exercise to ensure that the design of the learning environments considers the voices of children, especially girls, in the planning and implementation phases, and reflects their needs to enhance the learning environment and reduces barriers to education. Therefore, this ToR is to recruit an individual consultant to conduct a study that can capture and incorporate the voice and aspirations of the beneficiaries in Al Jawf, Hajjah, Al Mahweet, Marib and Sada'a before designing and implementing the construction work.

# Purpose of Activity/Assignment:

The purpose of the exercise is to produce:

- Document reflecting school infrastructure needs in Al Jawf, Hajjah, Al Mahweet, Marib and Sada'a from the point of view of stakeholders, ensuring their voices especially these of children (boys and girls) are considered in the planning and implementation of the intended construction work

# Work Assignment- Specific Tasks to be completed:

the activities will include:

- Conduct a desk review of available literature on interactive studies documenting the needs, aspirations, and recommendations of the targeted population with regard to school construction including a focus on the new modular school that UNICEF is in consultation with the MoEs on their design.
- Draft the report template to be approved by UNICEF.
- Develop the guiding questions to be used in the Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) with children, including girls, children in rural and under-served areas, and children with disabilities, to solicit their views and feedback on current school construction and their recommendations on the new modular school structure.
- Draft the analysis framework of the data collected.
- Conduct the FGDs
- Submit the draft report (Arabic and English)
- Address feedback as shared by UNICEF and partners
