Purpose of Activity/Assignment:				

Background:

On May 11, 2022 the National School Nutrition Policy was tabled in the House of Representatives as a Green Paper and is now available for public feedback and consultation. It will then follow as series of steps in the policy development process to be finalized and approved as a National Policy. In keeping with the Sustainable Development Goals 2030, the National School Nutrition Policy, and supporting Nutrition Standards, once finalized and approved, will provide a national framework that promotes and facilitates healthy eating habits and a physically active lifestyles among students in Jamaica. The Policy is a part of a national response to improving the nutritional status of children in Jamaica and to highlight the significant policy and programmatic steps the Government of Jamaica has taken to address the threats faced by the Jamaican population resulting from unhealthy diet and physical inactivity.

Childhood obesity and overweight are issues of growing concern in Jamaica from infancy through the adolescent years - 8.5 per cent of children under age 5 are overweight. According to the Global School Based Student Health Survey, the rate of obesity doubled among adolescent boys and increased by almost 50% in adolescent girls aged 13-17 between 2010-2017. Fewer than one in four adolescents are engaged in some type of physical activity for at least 60 minutes each day. Poor nutrition and physical activity in the younger populations has the potential to negatively affect their educational attainment, physical, social and emotional health and development, with longer-term impacts on obesity and NCDs in later life. It is widely accepted that the food environment in and around schools influences our children's food choices and helps shape their eating habits. Additionally, good nutrition practices in schools can improve cognitive and academic performance.

The development, approval and implementation of the National School Nutrition Policy responds to the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) specifically, the fair treatment and best interest of the child, measures to safeguard the rights of children, including assessing our social services and funding for these services, governments responsibility to assist parents in fulfilling their role as nurturers and the right of the child to nutritious food and information to help them stay healthy as part of the right to health.

UNICEF Jamaica's Country Programme recognizes that equitable access adequate nutrition as critical step to achieving the right of the child to good health. This Programme aims to strengthen Jamaica's policy, legal and programming environment for improved child and adolescent nutrition. Recognizing that school nutrition policies can support good health and educational outcomes by ensuring adequate and equal access to healthy food for all students, UNICEF Jamaica seeks the services of a consultant to support the Ministry of Education and Youth, to finalize the National School Nutrition Policy, now a Green Paper, and Nutrition Standards through a consultative and participatory process.

Objective:

The overall objective of this consultancy is to:

- Review the National School Nutrition Policy, now a Green Paper, and provide updated current information/data to support the policy and to make recommendations for elimination of outdated ones where necessary (based on literature review).
- To review recommendations/suggestions made by stakeholders, access its credibility and consider for inclusion in the National School Nutrition Policy and National School Nutrition Standards where applicable.
- Conduct activities to enhance and support the Ministry of Education and Youth to advance and finalize the National School Nutrition Policy and supporting Nutrition Standards.

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 Develop a detailed workplan of activities and actions with a projected timeline required for successful completion of the assignment 					
2. Attend planned stakeholder consultations/town hall events to generate feedback on the draft policy and recommendations for full promotion and implementation					
3. Provide technical assistance to revise the Policy (Green Paper), as needed, incorporating recommendations from MoEY, MOHW and stakeholder consultations					
4. Prepare regular reports from consultations including feedback and recommendations for alignment, finalization and full implementation of the policy document, and consensus on key components of the policy Finalize policy for advancement through the policy development process
