BACKGROUND & ORGANIZATIONAL CONTEXT

Return to Happiness (RTH) is a psychosocial first aid (PFA) recovery programme developed by UNICEF to support those who have experienced trauma from disaster, crisis, conflict or violence. Children and teachers who participate in the Return to Happiness receive support which is aimed at helping them to process their stress and trauma and to begin looking towards the future. Beginning in 2021, RTH has been delivered periodically as an online, asynchronous short course by the Jamaica Teaching Council (JTC) in partnership with UNICEF and the Department of Social Work at the University of the West Indies, resulting in some 600 teachers having been trained in the psychosocial first aid (PFA) based methodology.

On July 3, 2024, Hurricane Beryl, a category 4, storm wreaked tremendous damage on Jamaica's southern coast. In the education sector, teachers and children have lost homes, personal belongings and are without water, light or internet. Approximately 300 schools have reported damages from the hurricane, totalling around JD2.7 billion, primarily impacting roofs. Many families are grappling with financial strain, as they are forced to dip into savings meant for back-to-school expenses to cover house repairs. There is widespread concern about how these financial pressures will impact their ability to meet educational costs by September 2024 when schools will be opening.

UNICEF is exploring options to support the sector as it prepares to return to school with training in the PFA-focused Return to Happiness methodology for at least 300 teachers in affected areas as well as back-to-school supplies for the families identified as most in need. The proposed series of face-to-face RTH focused sessions are intended to first address wellness needs of teachers brought on by the hurricane and subsequently to support these teachers to provide psychosocial support to students upon the opening of the 2024-25 school year. Additionally, psychosocial support for children and adolescents in the affected communities is critical. UNICEF is working with CSOs to deliver psychosocial support and build coping life skills among children and adolescents.

Consequently, the UNICEF Jamaica office requires the services of a consultant to support the delivery of the psychosocial first aid focused RTH programme in the southern region of the island as part of overall Hurricane Beryl response efforts and ongoing capacity building in Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS).

PURPOSE OF ASSIGNMENT

The purpose of this Consultancy is two-fold: a) to provide technical support at a regional level for the enhancement of the enabling environment to support teachers' use of the Return to Happiness methodology through a series of face-to-face PFA sessions by the end of August 2024; b) To deliver at least 2 x 1 day psychological first aid training sessions.

Under the guidance of UNICEF, the Consultant will work in collaboration with UNICEF, the Jamaica Teaching Council, the Guidance Counselling Unit of the Ministry of Education and Youth (MOEY), Eve



for Life and other relevant partners, to facilitate the requisite trainings using the adapted UNICEF Jamaica Return to Happiness (RTH) Manual and the UN PFA training manual.

This will include:

- Review of the existing RTH Manual to excerpt relevant content to deliver a series of five (5)
 PFA focused one day workshop sessions targeting 60 teachers each (for a total of 300) to be staged in feasible locations across the southern region by the end of September 2024.
- Develop and deliver an add on play therapy-based component for teachers to support their own psychosocial recovery from the trauma of the hurricane. Make any referrals to the health system as needed.
- Development and implementation of a data collection tool to solicit information from participants post training on the integration and delivery of specified elements of the RTH/PFA approach.
- Work with the JTC to curate a series of at least ten (10) tiktoks to capture some of the activities and be shared as a way of broadly disseminating key messages and serve as a reference point for teachers in the 2024-25 school year.
- Deliver 2 x 1-day sessions among CSO partners and volunteers on psychological first aid.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

UNICEF Jamaica is seeking the services of a consultant to: a) provide a series of five (5) one day, PFA focused sessions for at least 300 teachers in the southern region of the island in August, working closely with the UNICEF Jamaica Country Office as well as the Jamaica Teaching Council (JTC), the Guidance Counselling Unit (GCU) and the Ministry of Health and Wellness (MOHW); b) Deliver 2x 1 day sessions on psychological first aid with CSO partners and volunteers.

Cost Estimates are invited for the coordination of the sessions.

Scope of Work:

- Review existing relevant training material, design and deliver the five PFA-focused one-day sessions with a play therapy component, making any referrals to the health system as needed.
- Manage all logistics (registration, identification of locations and catering) in coordination with the Jamaica Teaching Council
- Develop and maintain status reporting tools regarding project milestones, timelines and deliverables (including the series of key message tiktoks)
- Ensure proactive and consistent flow of communication and collaboration with all the partners and stakeholders, highlighting issues on a timely basis.
