The Office of Research-Innocenti (OoR) is the dedicated research office of UNICEF. It undertakes and commissions research on emerging or current issues of relevance for children to inform the strategic directions, policies and programs of UNICEF and its partners. The Office explores emerging issues, identifies research gaps, brings together existing researchers, and supports or undertakes research and data collection to address critical questions to inform global debates.

With the support of SIDA, OoR through the Transfer Project works with national governments to generate rigorous multi-country evidence on the impacts of cash and cash plus programmes in sub-Saharan Africa and humanitarian contexts. The objective is to inform better social protection policymaking, programme design, and implementation. The Transfer Project is a joint research and learning initiative led by UNICEF, the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), and the University of North Carolina (UNC) at Chapel Hill. Impact evaluations generally utilize mixed methods (quantitative and qualitative) and longitudinal data collection using experimental (randomized controlled trial) or quasi-experimental (matching, regression discontinuity) study designs. Studies examine various domains of impacts, including schooling, child labour, nutrition, physical and mental health, food security, productive impacts, time use, local economy effects, violence, and sexual and reproductive health. They have also explored the pathways through which impacts are achieved.

OoR is also leading another research programme, Gender-Responsive Age-Sensitive Social Protection (GRASSP), funded by FCDO. The programme seeks to strengthen the gender-responsiveness of social protection systems in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) by building a robust evidence base focused on 'what works', 'how' and 'why' to contribute to enhanced gender equality outcomes. By leveraging UNICEF's presence in 190 countries and drawing on partnerships with governments, international agencies, universities, and implementers, OoR is conducting cross-country research across three Research Streams: i) Improve the conceptualization, measurement, & analysis of gender equality outcomes; ii) Unpack change pathways by exploring design & implementation features; iii) Investigate how to institutionalize gender into social protection.

UNICEF Innocenti is seeking a consultant to support and co-lead mixed-methods impact evaluations of cash transfers and social programmes, secondary data analysis and the writing of reports, briefs and manuscripts. The consultant will also support dissemination activities and engage with UNICEF country offices, national stakeholders, and research partners.

Scope of Work: The consultant will perform the following activities:

1) Carry out research and related activities on the impact evaluation of cash transfer programmes under the Transfer Project. The consultant will:

- Contribute to and support the baseline, post-distribution monitoring and endline data collection, including support to questionnaire design, training, data collection, data management, data analysis, and contribute to report and manuscript writing;
- The consultant is also expected to support the processes needed to get buy-in from the relevant stakeholders in country through the organization of inception and dissemination workshops and supporting the dissemination of study findings to technical and non-technical audiences.
- 2) Support the implementation of mixed methods impact evaluations under the GRASSP research programme, including in Burkina Faso, DRC, and Mali.
 - Support the endline data collections, including support to questionnaire design, training, data collection, data quality checks, data management, data analysis, and contribute to report and manuscript writing;
 - Contribute to the preparation of GRASSP deliverables and support consultations/engagements with UNICEF country offices, national stakeholders, and research partners.
- 3) Collaborate with staff and other consultants in the following areas of research:
 - Contribute to analysis and drafting of peer reviewed manuscripts;
 - Present research findings in oral presentations and/or webinars;
 - Prepare policy briefs and other communication products targeted to country offices, government officials and stakeholders; and
- 4) Undertake related tasks in support of new proposals and other work in the SEP as required.
