Purpose of Activity/Assignment:

Despite some progress in the recent years, malnutrition remains a major challenge in Zambia. Stunting rates stand at 35 percent while wasting remains stagnant at 4 percent. Undernutrition among adolescent remains high and is of particular concern considering growing proportion of adolescent population in Zambia (25 percent of total population) and high prevalence of teenage pregnancies (29 percent). In addition, only 13 percent of children 6-23 months are fed a minimum of acceptable diet and less than 1 in 4 fed minimal dietary diversity. To address the widespread issue of malnutrition, the global movement "Scaling Up Nutrition" (SUN) was launched and Zambia joined the movement in 2010.

In line with SUN movement strategies and approaches, the Government Republic of Zambia (GRZ) designed and implemented its flagship programme "The First 1000 Most Critical Days Programme" (MCDP I) that has entered its second phase (MCDP-II). Under the MCDP-II framework, different partners are supporting the GRZ to implement programmes which are currently covering 42 high priority districts with high prevalence of stunting across the 10 provinces. UNICEF is the lead agency to implement the SUN-II Programme in collaboration with the National Food and Nutrition Commission (NFNC), government line ministries, NGOs, and other UN agencies in 17 districts. SUN-II Programme delivers a multi-sectoral package of both nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive interventions, adopting coordinated approaches of service delivery to achieve impact on stunting by focusing on households with adolescent girls, pregnant and breastfeeding women, children under 2 years, and women of reproductive age. The overall programme objective is to reduce stunting among children below 2 years by 7 percent in four years' time (2019-23).

Learnings throughout the SUN movement have identified that synergies and collaboration across various programmes and sectors are necessary for the success of SUN-II, particularly the interlinkages between the nutrition and health programmes to design and deliver an integrated package of Reproductive, Maternal, Neonatal, Child and Adolescent Health and Nutrition (RMNCAH&N) interventions using health sector platforms. SUN-II Programme has 4 outcome areas under which the following outputs are linked with the health sector:

- 1. Quality nutrition counselling on infant and young childcare and feeding practices
- 2. Quality nutrition counselling to adolescents and pregnant and lactating women
- 3. Use of quality maternal health, family planning and other health services
- 4. Strengthen connections between community health workers, volunteers, and health facilities
- 5. Conduct appropriate referrals for child health services
- 6. Conduct appropriate referrals for maternal health, family planning and other health services



SUN-II Programme focuses on strengthening the integrated health and nutrition service delivery at the district level, which require to closely collaborate with the health facilities, community health workers and community-based volunteers (CBVs). The Programme aims to reinforce and build effective referral services that connect children, adolescent girls and pregnant and lactating women to essential health and nutrition services and ensure appropriate follow-up care and counselling within the household. This requires a successful integration and delivery of RMNCAH&N interventions especially at the community level in the SUN-II Programme districts through effective planning, implementation, monitoring and reporting of activities implemented under the health sector.

The Programme has established a community structure called Nutrition Support Group for nutrition service delivery while the health sector (MoH) has rolled out their Community Health Strategy. There is a need for effective coordination and collaboration between RH Unit & Child Health and Nutrition Unit under the Public Health Department at MoH to ensure the achievement of results (listed below) related to Maternal and Child Health and Family Planning Services under the SUN-II programme. This requires technical support, effective coordination, and facilitation for planning, implementation, and monitoring of the RMNCAH&N interventions from national to community level especially among PHD, DHD and NGOs through District Nutrition Coordination Council (DNCCs). In order to achieve this, UNICEF's Health and HIV Section seeks an individual consultant with an expertise in public health and nutrition programme planning, implementation, monitoring and supervision to ensure that an integrated essential health and nutrition services are delivered to the women, adolescent and children.

Scope of Work:

The consultant, under the direct supervision of Health Specialist (RMNCAH) and overall guidance of the Chiefs of Health and Nutrition in UNICEF, will closely collaborate with MoH Public Health Department (both the Child Health and Nutrition Unit and the Reproductive Health Unit) and NFNC, Provincial Health Directors (PHDs), District Health Directors (DHDs), WHO, NGOs and other implementing partners. This role specifically focuses on the integration of nutrition interventions across various RMNCAH interventions being supported by the health sector, and must ensure effective coordination of the multi-sectoral components of the SUN-II programme's broader programme goals



The key elements of the assignment are as follows:

- i. Integration of Health and Nutrition Actions Provide technical and coordination support to integrated planning and delivery of RMNCAH&N services in the SUN-II programme, including the design, review, implementation, and monitoring of RMNCAH&N programmes across 17 SUN-II districts. For the planning, the consultant will work with DHD, DNCCs and NGO partners at district level; with PHD, PNCCs and NGO partners at provincial level and with various units of MoH Public Health Department and NFNC for development of Health Sector Specific Work Plan for SUN-II, and facilitate implementation and service delivery of integrated health and nutrition interventions (RMNCAH) at district level. The consultant will act as an interface between Reproductive Unit and Child Health & Nutrition Unit of MoH at national level, provide support to Provincial Health Office (PHO) and District Health Office (DHO) related to health and nutrition activities for the SUN-II Programme.
- ii. <u>Technical Assistance on Standards and Protocols Development</u> Provide technical support and health related inputs for drafting of technical guidelines, SOPs, and job-aids on various thematic areas under SUN-II such as IMAM, in-patient management of SAM cases, BFHI, interface between Community Health System and Nutrition Support Group, Strengthening outreach services for referral for maternal (ANC, PNC, FP) and child health (EPI, IMCI) services, C4D and SBCC (nutrition-sensitive health services),
- iii. <u>Intersectoral Coordination</u> Undertake regular coordination with SUN-II team including relevant ministries and partners; interface between the UNICEF health section and the MOH on SUN II implementation and linkage with provincial and district health offices; represent health section across various SUN-II coordination / meetings/ working groups/ review platforms, ensuring the availability of accurate, complete, and up-to-date information on the status of implementation of health (RMNCAH) interventions under the SUN-II programme. Provide support to 17 districts to strengthen coordination between DHO and DNCCs for the SUN-II Programme.
- iv. <u>Data and Evidence Generation</u> Analyse available programme and HMIS data; and provide updated data and information on the coverage, continuity and equity on health (RMNCAH) interventions in 17 SUN-II programme districts with identification of gaps and technical and coordination support with MoH, partner agencies and nutrition team to provide feedback and identification of strategic actions to address the gaps.
- v. Programme Monitoring and Reporting Coordinate and lead the drafting of the health sections inputs for the SUN II programme reviews, programme presentations, donor reports, annual report and other programme documentation related to coverage, continuity, and equity on health (RMNCAH) interventions in 17 SUN-II districts. Support the districts in strengthening the nutrition information system for recording and reporting under health sector for the SUN-II Programme
- vi. <u>Supportive Supervision -</u> Undertaking field visits to provinces, districts, and sub-districts with focus on 17 SUN-II districts for monitoring and supervision of project activities and to improve the coverage, continuity and equity of integrated health and nutrition interventions.
