Purpose of Activity/Assignment:

UNICEF is supporting Ministry of Health in implementation of Electronic Immunization Registration (EIR) system in Lao PDR. The digital health ecosystem in Laos comprises a blend of client-centric paper-based and digital systems. The Ministry of Health (MoH) has focused its digital health efforts on consolidating the District Health Information System 2 (DHIS2) as a Health Management Information System (HMIS), providing aggregated, high-level health data for operational planning.

Before receiving Japanese funding through UNICEF for Supporting Digital Health Systems for Infectious Diseases Control, the Ministry of Health introduced the EIR system using GAVI Health System Strengthening (HSS) funding. However, further resources were required for nationwide rollout. Since May 2022, MoH and partners have conducted several rounds of technical consultations on EIR sustainability, agreeing to continue using DHIS2 for individual recording, as it was used for COVID-19 vaccine recording. In October 2022, DHIS2 was agreed upon as the primary tool for deploying EIR nationwide.

The EIR system was piloted in Hadsaifong district, Vientiane Capital, led by MoH, Maternal and Child Health Centre (MCHC), and Department of Planning and Cooperation (DPC), with participation from development partners like UNICEF, WHO, and HISP Vietnam-Lao office. Training was conducted in January 2023 at the district hospital, where partners facilitated the sessions, marking the first time MCHC and development partners had access to the EIR system alongside district staff.

Following consultations, the Ministry of Health decided to proceed with further trainings and scaling up the EIR system to all 18 provinces. UNICEF conducted master trainer training in July and completed nationwide training of all the health workers from August to December 2023. The scale-up was also discussed during the Annual EPI planning meeting, where UNICEF advocated for a clear roadmap, ensuring sustainability of investments in equipment, technology, and capacity building.

UNICEF has recruited 25 data field support officers to ensure timely and quality implementation of the EIR system rollout. Trained by UNICEF and MoH, these officers were provided with laptops and deployed to provincial health offices to conduct monitoring, troubleshooting, data entry, and dashboard production.

The preliminary report generated from the District Health Information Software (DHIS2) EIR indicates that by mid-January 2024, more than 70% of children under the age of two, totalling over 275,000 children, have already been individually registered in the system. This accomplishment is deemed significant for a project like EIR in its early stage of implementation.

Scope of Work:

Under the overall supervision of HSS Manager, the consultant will support implementation of EIR tracker in Lao PDR and will assist Immunization team in smooth execution and coordination of following tasks:

- 1. Develop an action plan/road map for EIR implementation.
- 2. Develop training video script on EIR system operation.
- 3. Support the development of ToR for EIR performance assessment.
- 4. Work with the MOH teams from DPC, MCHC, NIP and T4D specialist of UNICEF for inclusion of findings and fixing any technical issues related to EIR.
- 5. Supervise EIR data officers who support in central and provincial hospitals by organizing regular weekly/monthly meeting to identify possible challenges which may be occurred during their mission at each facility.
- 6. Support in organizing and develop presentation for EIR annual review meeting.
- 7. Conduct supervision at subnational level to ensure EIR system well-functioning.
- 8. Follow up with provinces to identify key challenges on EIR system operation at each level and suggest recommendation to improve its coverage.
- 9. Regular analysis to triangulate data with DHIS2 & other digital systems to improve its performance.

The duration of this consultancy is 20 months. For planning purpose, the timelines have been indicated in below table. However, the actual timelines will be agreed with the successful applicant based on technical proposal. The deliverables will require extensive



planning and travel to achieve the results. Therefore, Consultant will be allowed to travel seven days a month to achieve the deliverables throughout the consultancy period and therefore the lumpsum cost per deliverable could be derived/estimated accordingly.
