# **Purpose of Activity/Assignment:**

Under the direction and guidance of the Deputy Representative (Programmes) and with delegated authority to lead the response beyond programmes, the incumbent will coordinate overall country office emergency preparedness and response, specifically on cholera and drought emergencies and any emergency that may occur. Guided by UNICEF CCCs, the incumbent is responsible for the planning, coordination, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of emergency preparedness and response.

## Background

Zambia is currently facing an outbreak of Cholera and drought. The country started registering cholera cases in October 2023. As of mid-March, over 21,000 cumulative cases have been registered across all the ten provinces of the country, with 712 cumulative deaths (293 in facilities and 419 in the communities). This has been the worst episode of cholera for over 50 years and children have been disproportionally affected.

Over the past month, there has been a decline in the number of cases nationwide. This is largely due to the decline in cases reported in Lusaka Province, the hotspot of the Cholera Outbreak. Conversely, there has been an increase of cases in other provinces namely Copperbelt, Southern and Central Province. The rate of attack is equally on the decline. As of epidemiological week 11, case fatality rate was at 3.3%. At its peak, it was at 4%, with up to 72 districts reporting cases.

On 29 February 2024, the President of the Republic of Zambia declared a national state of emergency because of the drought affecting large parts of Zambia, resulting from the onset of El Niño conditions and climate change. The dry spell from mid-Jan 2024 is affecting most of the central and southern. Half of the country which has received substantially less than normal rainfall leaving:

- 84/116 districts (72%) severely affected in the 7 provinces of Lusaka, Central, Copperbelt, Eastern, North-western, Western and Southern.
- 1 million (out of 2.2 million) hectares of planted areas for maize were destroyed. Increases in commodity prices are expected.
- 430-megawatt power deficit, potentially reaching more than 520 mega-watts by December 2024
- Ground & surface water availability levels are affected, with potential to increase the incidence of diseases among the affected population.
- 1 million farming households (6.5 million people) are impacted among these 3 million are children aged under 18 and 1.2 million are children aged under 5. These households face prolonged food security, with heightened risks of common childhood illnesses, vaccine preventable disease outbreaks and malnutrition.



## **Objectives**

The objective of this Terms of Reference therefore to support the country office in coordinating the drought response.

- Emergency response assessment through participation in needs assessment, field missions and other tasks as appropriate
- Emergency repose plans and revisions as required.
- Produce regular update on emergency response and ffacilitate weekly internal Emergency Coordination meetings.
- Produce resource mobilization proposals when the opportunities arise.
- Oversee quality weekly monitoring and reporting of SitRep to regional office.
- Support the office with the resource mobilization by clearly articulating the priority needs
  of the affected children and their families and contributing to the development of the
  proposals and donor engagement.
- Ensure appropriate coordination internally and externally and provide updates.
- Ensure that core SOPs, protocols and tools for emergency response are in place and implemented (including Accountability to Affected Populations (AAP) mechanisms, Gender mainstreaming and PSEA guidance internal 4Ws, SharePoint Site for Knowledge sharing and collaboration).
