Purpose of Activity/Assignment:

For 75 years, UNICEF has been working on the ground in 190 countries and territories to promote children's survival, protection, and development. The world's largest provider of vaccines for developing countries, UNICEF supports child health and nutrition, good water and sanitation, quality basic education for all boys and girls, and the protection of children from violence, exploitation, and AIDS. UNICEF is funded entirely by the voluntary contributions of individuals, businesses, foundations, and governments.

UNICEF Lao PDR is committed to support Government of Lao People's Democratic Republic in its effortsto promote and protect rights of all children and to ensure quality and equity in healthcare for all the citizens. In continuation with these efforts, UNICEF Lao PDR is glad to be supporting the Ministry of Health to promote COVID-19 vaccination and its safety and effectiveness.

In association with the National Immunization Program (NIP), Centre of Communication and Education for Health (CCEH) and with support from World Health Organization (WHO) along with other development partners, UNICEF has launched a nationwide campaign- #VaccinateLaos. The campaign was launched to align with the vaccination rollout in the country in 2021.

The campaign not only advocates for the safety and effectiveness of the vaccine but also aims at buildingtrust and awareness and reiterates importance of following COVID appropriate behaviors (CABs) like hand washing, wearing mask and maintaining physical distance.

The campaign has been receiving positive response and active engagement from vaccine recipients resulting in spreading the positive message and encouraging more people to get vaccinated.

Along with the campaign on social media platforms, UNICEF is also working closely with CCEH and mass organizations in Lao PDR to implement risk communication and community engagement (RCCE) activities. These activities are aimed at ensuring ownership, accountability and responsibility of communities to increase uptake of vaccination.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had an unprecedented impact on human lives and economies globally. Lao PDR is experiencing fluctuating COVID-19 cases despite ongoing vaccination efforts, which have faced challenges in communicating accurate and updated information. It is crucial to scale up communication efforts to emphasize the safety and effectiveness of the vaccine and the continued need for COVID appropriate behavior. Additionally, routine immunization must continue uninterrupted to prevent children from being deprived of life-saving vaccines due to disruptions caused by COVID-19. Strengthening communication around COVID-19 vaccination and routine immunization in Lao PDR is essential to restore the lives of families and children and ensure that no one is left behind in these difficult times.

UNICEF Lao PDR plans to procure the services of a Communication for Immunization consultant. This would be a full-time consultancy which would involve timely coordination with the representatives of MOH and mass organization at central, province and district level for implementation and monitoring of various RCCE activities on- ground. The consultant will also facilitate organizing filed visits as and when required and would also participate in these visits.

The consultancy would also entail regular coordination with various implementing partners regarding dissemination of communication materials.

The consultant must be a mid-level professional and possesses good communication skills in Lao and English. The consultant is also expected to manage dissemination of various communication materials through the national and regional partners.

Under the overall guidance of Social and Behavioral Change Specialist in UNICEF Lao PDR, the consultant will work closely with the CCEH and UNICEF Lao PDR to strengthen RCCE. In particular, the consultant will:

- 1. Ensure timely coordination with representatives from the Ministry of Health (MOH) and mass organizations at central, provincial, and district levels for effective implementation of RCCE activities.
- 2. Organize and conduct monitoring field visits in close coordination with the Center for Communication and Education in Health (CCEH) and the National Immunization Program (NIP) to assess the progress and identify areas for improvement.
- 3. Review reports from provincial and district representatives to identify challenges and barriers in conducting RCCE activities on the ground and provide recommendations for addressing them.
- 4. Participate in field visits along with UNICEF and MOH representatives to ensure effective implementation of RCCE activities. Facilitate translations for non-Lao speakers to ensure that information is accessible to all.
- 5. Support the NIP Immunization Unit at provincial and district levels in organizing district-level workshops, briefings, and trainings on the importance of strengthening risk communication and community engagement (RCCE). This will involve engaging local government health officials, health workers, members of Village Development Committees, mass organizations, and local media.
- Support health center staff in conducting social mobilization and RCCE activities with village chiefs, community leaders, and Village Health Volunteers to promote the benefits of COVID vaccination and reaching zero-dose children for vaccination.
- 7. Support district and health center-level staff in implementing targeted messages in local languages using appropriate means of communication to reach underserved, hard-to-reach, and remote communities.
- 8. Perform generic tasks related to coordination for dissemination of communication materials to ensure that they are effectively distributed.
- 9. Assess gender-based barriers to health literacy, vaccine literacy, and vaccination uptake and provide recommendations to address them.
- 10. Collaborate with the gender specialist for intervention planning and implementation, to ensure that gender considerations are integrated into all aspects of the RCCE activities.
