Purpose of Activity/Assignment:

Provide support to CORE MIS customisation for use in the Social Cash Transfer (SCT) System and technical support for the implementation of the SCT data management to meet program needs as agreed with the MCDSS, testing the systems, and training client IT teams on the use and maintenance of the CORE-MIS.

Scope of Work:

In response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, UNICEF supported the Government of the Republic of Zambia through the Ministry of Community Development and Social Services (MCDSS) in the development and implementation of the COVID-19 Emergency Cash Transfer (C-ECT) programme. Given the sizeable caseload for the C-ECT and the need to manage temporary beneficiaries under the horizontal expansion of the programme, the World Bank proposed to UNICEF to use the CORE MIS they developed to assist countries and organizations in the rapid delivery of emergency cash transfers to safety net beneficiaries and to vulnerable informal sector workers in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and tailor it to fit UNICEF requirements. The CORE MIS is a web-based application, developed using exclusively free and open source tools, that can be used to support the implementation of social protection programs.

In view of the imminent horizontal expansion of the Social Cash Transfer (SCT) Program, the Government of Zambia and the donor community agreed that the ZISPIS in its current form would not be able to meet the increasing technical needs of the program, such as an app for registration of potential beneficiaries and their household data, a data cleaning module, an integrated PMT module, a GRM module, and a direct link to the GEWEL payment gateway for digital payments. The CORE-MIS was the suggested instrument to fill this gap, with the agreement that it could be set up with the missing modules in an initial phase, and later enhanced by a third party in a second phase. Furthermore, the previous positive experience of UNICEF's use of the CORE-MIS and the relatively rapid set-up process of this end-to-end system would ensure that SCT was able to provide continued and long-term support to beneficiaries including those covered by the ECT.

Given the tight deadlines to deliver a robust and efficient MIS for the SCT Program, there is a clear opportunity to leverage the positive experience and ongoing work on the ECT MIS. Many of the previous customizations that were carried out for the ECT MIS will now feature on SCT's new MIS (e.g. the KoBo view-in-view feature) including some of the important back-end coding of geographical locations and payment functionalities. As such it is expected that, though there are some important customizations to be made for the SCT Program's particular activities and methodology, the SCT's new MIS will be enhanced and operational within a rapid timeframe.

Against this background, the CORE MIS Developer Consultant will provide technical support for the implementation of the SCT's management information system through the customization of the existing CORE-MIS to meet program needs. Historical data will be migrated, and user experiences on the ZISPIS will be mirrored and improved with further modules that will add to the program's technical capacity.

The specific tasks to be undertaken by the CORE MIS Developer Consultant will include:
