TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSULTANTS

National WASH consultant for monitoring, quality assurance and documentation of WASH in HCFs Purpose of Activity/Assignment: The purpose of this consultancy is to support UNICEF WASH Programme for overall coordination, monitoring, quality assurance and documentation of WASH works in health care facilities. Scope of Work: The scope of work for this consultancy is to support UNICEF WASH Programme for the overall coordination, monitoring, quality assurance and documentation of WASH works in health care facilities commissioned by UNICEF in 2024. This includes different water and sanitation services, solar energy system installation, in health care facilities located in Kratie, Mondulkiri, Ratanakiri, Stung Treng, Preah Vihear, and Pursat provinces. The consultancy will particularly focus on the technical review and assurance at critical points of UNICEF commissioned WASH activities, ensure engagement and coordination of different counterparts, support the UNICEF WASH team in managing the different contractors involved and orient/support the various technical experts and sits uspervisors hired. The consultant will primarily review related WASH project documents; develop a master schedule and tools for quality assurance with its regularly update; conduct monitoring and reporting the progress and support the preparation of different knowledge management products as subsequently requested by the UNICEF team. The consultant, for the duration of the deployment, is required to produce brief monthly reports, highlighting achievements and bottlenecks and other updates. A) Technical Evaluation (100 points): Weight 70 %

- Degree in water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) or related majors (30 points)
- Experience in quality assurance and documentation of WASH facility construction (30 points)
- Previous work experience in WASH in health care facility with international organizations (40 points)

B) Financial Proposal (100 points): Weight 30 %

The maximum number of points shall be allotted to the lowest Financial Proposal that is opened /evaluated and compared among those technical qualified candidates who have attained a minimum 65 points score in the technical evaluation. Other Financial Proposals will receive points in inverse proportion to the lowest price.
