## **Background:**

UNICEF's Child Protection Program for Kharkiv Oblast will support safe and nurturing families for all Ukrainian children. This includes ensuring that every child at risk of or experiencing loss of care undergoes a thorough assessment and planning process that helps them access material support and other services that meet their needs, with a view of ensuring that they grow up and develop in a caring and safe family environment. This Program will support the local Government to advance the following three objectives: (1) strengthen families and keep them together by investing in social services; (2) support family-based alternative care (e.g. foster care, guardianship, and adoption) for children without adequate parental care; and (3) ensuring the development of and access to a minimum package of social services and resilience services. Furthermore, Kharkiv Oblast remains affected by the ongoing armed conflict with children and their parents evacuated and displaced within and outside the Oblast.

## Purpose of assignment:

The consultant will work closely with UNICEF's implementing partners, provide technical support to the Child Protection Section, and work under the direct management of the Child Protection Specialist in Kharkiv to support to ensure the coordinated implementation of child protection programmes at the Oblast and notably Hromada levels through close collaboration with Deputy Mayors, Child Affairs Services, Social Services and other local actors, implementing partners and other UNICEF colleagues. Notably, the consultant will:

- Development, in coordination with UNICEF's Implementing Partners of detailed Workplans on Family-Based Alternative Care within Hromadas: One of the key goals of the Kharkiv Oblast program is to ensure the availability of a "Minimal Package of Services and Benefits" within Hromadas and strengthen of the alternative care system. The consultant will work closely with pilot Hromadas, Oblast-level administration (through an established Taskforce), and UNICEF team to develop and gradually update Hromada-level Work Plans, which will aim to create/improve human and institutional capabilities locally in the 12 priority Hromadas.
- Support the rollout of monitoring and evaluation procedures and frameworks in order to ensure the
  proper monitoring and reporting of progress of the Better Care Reform in 12 priority Hromadas,
  including by strengthening services, alternative care and resilience centres and services.



- Support to local authorities and child protection actors to setup and strengthen coordination
  mechanisms and tools at the local level as well as reporting to the Oblast-level authorities and UNICEF
  office.
- Strengthen the capacity of implementing partners and local child protection and other actors on the workplan, M&E framework, reporting requirements and tools that will be developed by the consultant, in collaboration with authorities, UNICEF and its partners as well as other and other topics pertinent to the Better Care Reform through trainings, mentoring, supervision and other modalities.
- Coordination of implementing partners at regional level through regular communication with partners
  in the field and updates of the UNICEF team and direct supervisor on the overall progress of programme
  implementation, achievements, and constraints.
- Provide regular updates on programme progress in Hromadas and through data collection and regular reporting, including inputs to donor reports briefing notes and other documents, as required.

The consultant will work closely with and under the supervision of the Child Protection Specialist Function at Kharkiv Field Office UNICEF Team.
