Purpose of Activity/Assignment: To ensure UNICEF's COVID-19 support across the country by supporting the						
Ministry of Health and other partners in coordinating and facilitating effective implementation of critical						
COVID-19 response activities including vaccine supplies, risk communication, community engagement,						
capacity building and strengthening of the cold chain in response to COVID-19.						

#### Background

The Republic of Suriname detected its first case of COVID 19 on Friday, March 13, 2020. Since April 2021, the country is experiencing a third wave of the pandemic, and the increasing cases and deaths are of great concern to the government of Suriname and its partners. In the absence of definitive therapeutic options for the management and control of this disease, vaccination as a primary prevention measure is the best option for controlling the disease and save lives through reduction of severe cases and deaths.

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought the importance of resilient health systems back in focus and exposed weaknesses in health system. Since April 2021, the country is experiencing a third wave of the pandemic which evolved into a 4<sup>th</sup> wave before significantly slowing down. Currently the country is experiencing a 5<sup>th</sup> wave of infections and the Omicron variant has been confirmed in Suriname. The increasing number of cases and deaths are of great concern to the government of Suriname and its partners. The vaccine rolled out started in February 2021 in Suriname and currently there are various COVID-19 vaccines available. To date Suriname has reached 48.77% of the target population being fully vaccinated, 6.43% partially vaccinated, and 9.2% received a booster shot (February 22, 2022, <u>www.laatjevaccineren.sr</u>).

UNICEF has been working closely with the Ministry of Health in the implementation of the COVID-19 deployment plan by supporting and providing technical and financial support for demand generation, risk communication cold chain, vaccine roll-out planning and preparedness, WASH and Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) in health facilities and school settings and improving planning and coordination.

UNICEF will continue to support the efforts of the Government for COVID -19 vaccine, program planning and management in the country with a particular focus on UNICEF's key mandate areas – Cold Chain and Vaccine Supply Management, and Communication and Community Engagement and coordinate health section and with supply and other sections for a coordinated response.

#### Scope of Work:

Ensure UNICEF's COVID-19 support across the country by supporting the Government of Suriname in coordinating vaccine supplies, risk communication, community engagement, capacity building and strengthening of the cold chain in response to COVID-19.

## Tasks

The consultant will complete the following work assignments under direct supervision of UNICEF:

# Technical assistance:

- Provide technical assistance to the government on the coordination of COVID-19 vaccines, including prioritization of activities, implementation strategies, readiness of key components to deliver smooth vaccine roll-out, including strengthening the cold chain.
- Support the development and implementation of activities related to capacity building, vaccine demand creation and overall risk communication and community engagement activities from a public health perspective.
- Provide expertise to partners in the Development/contextualization of technical guidelines and protocols on matters related to COVID-19 infection Prevention and Control (IPC).
- Prepare TOR's and assist with project planning for implementation of activities through partners and service providers and support with the procurement processes.

# Coordination & project management:

- Liaise with Ministry of Health, the coordination task force, partners and relevant stakeholders for program improvement, review and coordination of the pertinent thematic components like monitoring & supervision, vaccine & logistics management, cold chain, adverse events following immunization (AEFI), communication etc.
- Coordinate and collaborate with UN agencies on joint COVID-19 interventions.
- Coordinate with UNICEF implementing partners and consultants to ensure project implementation is in line with planning, track progress and advice on adaptation and elimination of bottlenecks.
- Undertake field visits to monitor the planning and implementation of COVID-19 response and provide feedback at appropriate levels.

### Reporting and evidence generation:

- Monitoring of UNICEF supported COVID-19 support activities, collect and analyse data, and generate progress reports on UNICEF COVID-19 response for internal and donor reporting.
- Support implementing partners in evidence generation for reporting based on established indicators.
- Support the design and implementation of evidence generation activities (e.g., surveys to understand vaccine hesitancy).
- Keep an update of the UNICEF-specific support, especially requirements and pipelines related to the cold chain, vaccines, and logistics related to COVID-19 vaccination.
- Prepare Covid-19 situation update-weekly.
