1. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

UNICEF is committed to the central role of research, monitoring and evaluation in results-based management, and continually seeks to strengthen the evidence and data function with a view to supporting programming. While furthering accountability towards governments, donors and other partners, data and evidence can yield lessons that will further enhance UNICEF's contribution to development and the lives of children across the world.

In accordance with UNICEF's decentralized structure, most evidence and data activities are conducted at country and regional levels. Important challenges include strategic coverage, coherence, accessibility and timeliness, and ensuring that quality standards are consistently met.

UNICEF India has recently developed its own Evidence Strategy, in which data is positioned as a key strategic priority. A new Evidence Unit within UNICEF India has been created to be able to provide the strategic direction and leadership on evidence and data for children.

While there is a significant demand for support from UNICEF on data work, and the office undertakes a large volume of very strategic initiatives with government and other partners, there are a few critical and common challenges that continue to hamper the agenda on evidence for children, linked to data availability, disaggregation, quality, but also use. There is a need to further understand these challenges, and crucially identify feasible opportunities and entry-points to address them, at both national and state levels. In addition, while programmes and field offices lead their own efforts, it is imperative to have a comprehensive, strategic Data Action Plan for country office that serves to guide and prioritize investments by UNICEF India Office for the next 5 years around data for children and the data ecosystem in India.

The UNICEF India Country Office is seeking support of a senior Data Consultant to support Statistics and Monitoring Specialist in preparing a Data Action Plan that provides strategic direction and a concrete roadmap for the next 5 years of specific data efforts UNICEF needs to undertake to strengthen the ecosystem, bridging the data gaps around children in India.

The purpose of this short-term consultancy is to support Evidence section in preparing Data Action Plan for India Country Office (2023-2027).

2. OBJECTIVES

The objective of this consultancy is to support the Evidence section to work toward achieving the following outcomes:

- To identify the prioritized data issues to be addressed across UNICEF India programmatic domains, at the national and at the state level, basis an updated analysis of the current challenges in the ecosystem and the emerging priorities from Government of India and other stakeholders, as well as aligning UNICEF's global data strategy.
- ii. To recommend strategic, concrete, and feasible interventions or actions that UNICEF India can take to address these issues, to work towards strengthening of data ecosystems and bridging the key data gaps across UNICEF India programme domains.

3. Scope of Work for Data Action Plan:

Thematic scope

There are two aspects to the proposed thematic scope: first, focusing on the strategies the office should employ to accelerate its data initiatives, such as capacity building of government, data partnerships, ethics and responsible data for children, innovation and technology; second, focusing on cross-sectoral thematic agendas or beams, which requires convergence and should be integrated into all programmes – such as Climate Change, Gender and Equity (including Disability), Early Childhood Development and Adolescent Empowerment. For example, for Gender, the Data Action Plan will aim to suggest some realistic opportunities and entry points, based on a feasibility analysis, to obtain gender-relevant and sex-segregated data for critical child indicators, which may cover opportunities for advocacy, analytics, and indicator measurement/definitions. Note that the exact thematic scope will be decided in consultation with the CMT and other relevant experts.

Geographical scope

The Data Action Plan will focus on both the national level and the state level since the issues and opportunities vary greatly from one state to another. Since it will not be feasible to cover all the states in this exercise, a few will be selected, to ensure a mix of different contexts is examined. If field offices would like to develop their own Data Action Plan, drawing on the ICO-level one, this can be a next step to this exercise

The specific tasks of this consultancy will be:

- i. An updated data landscape analysis, with a comprehensive summary narrative of the key challenges and opportunities in the data ecosystem and key recommendations for 7-10 priority data investments the office needs to make in the next 5 years
- ii. An action plan matrix, including suggested initiatives/actions/interventions, expected outcomes, key partners and stakeholders to involve (national/state), timelines for the next five years.
- iii. Separate investment/use cases for each of the areas as defined under the thematic scope, which can be used in advocacy with government and fundraising
- iv. A summary brief and visual infographic/representation of the Data Action Plan for external communication, to help position UNICEF India's agenda around data
