Purpose of Activity/Assignment:

Background:

The fundamental mission of UNICEF is to promote the rights of every child, everywhere, in everything the organization does — in programmes, in advocacy and in operations. The equity strategy, emphasizing the most disadvantaged and excluded children and families, translates this commitment to children's rights into action. For UNICEF, equity means that all children have an opportunity to survive and thrive without discrimination, bias or favoritism. To the degree that any child has an unequal chance in life — in its social, political, economic, civic and cultural dimensions — her or his rights are violated.

There is growing evidence that investing in the health, nutrition, education and protection of a society's most disadvantaged citizens — addressing inequity — not only will give all children the opportunity to fulfill their potential but also will lead to sustained growth and stability of countries. This is why the focus on equity is so vital. It accelerates progress towards realizing the human rights of all children, which is the universal mandate of UNICEF, as outlined by the Convention on the Rights of the Child, while also supporting the equitable development of nations.

UNICEF Jamaica has been working with the Government of Jamaica to address inequities in health. Among the issues that affect the health of Jamaican children at their earliest stage of life through the period of adolescence is nutrition – infant and young child feeding for newborns through to age five, middle childhood and the period of adolescence call for varied nutritional requirements. In order for families to make informed choices regarding nutrition for children, a coordinated effort is necessary including actions from policy makers, food industry actors, school administrators, healthcare practitioners, parents and children themselves.

UNICEF Jamaica requires the services of a consultant to support the implementation of its nutrition programme.

Purpose of the Job

The Nutrition Consultant will provide technical assistance, guidance and support for programme/project design, planning and implementation. The consultant will also provide monitoring support including data analysis, progress reporting, knowledge generation, networking and capacity building, in support of achievement of planned objectives of the work plan and programme goals. In addition, the consultant will be tasked to perform key administrative duties required for efficient implementation of programme/project activities.



Key Functions, Accountabilities & Tasks

1. Support to programme development and planning

- Assists the preparation and periodic update of the Situation Analysis by compiling Health and Nutrition data, analysing and evaluating relevant information and providing the technical input in a timely and accurate manner. Drafts reports and assists with preparation of sectoral input to the programme documents as required.
- Assists in the development of the nutrition elements of the Health Programme work plan and participates in technical discussions and decisions for efficient administration, implementation and monitoring of sectoral project activities. Monitors to ensure nutrition objectives and targets are timely met and achieved, through effective coordination and collaboration, by participating in a teamwork of professional and support staff. Support maintenance of info system for monitoring gender sex aggregated data.
- Provide technical and operational support throughout all stages of programming processes by executing and administering a variety of technical programme transactions; preparing materials and reports as necessary;

2. Programme management, monitoring and delivery of results.

- Work closely and collaboratively with UNICEF colleagues and partners to discuss operational and implementation issues as it relates to Nutrition programme goals and objectives. In particular, the following key programme issues: Advocacy on front of package food labeling; Expansion of the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative; Capacity strengthening of the Infant and Young Child Feeding Network; Support to the Jamaica Moves in Schools Programme and Addressing adolescent nutrition education and skills among other key programme priorities.
- Keep record of reports and assessments for easy reference and/or to capture and institutionalize lessons learned.
- Participate in monitoring and evaluation exercises, programme visits, periodic programme reviews with the government and other counterparts to assess programmes/projects and to report on required action and interventions at the higher level of programme management.
- Contribute to the monitoring and reporting on the use of sectoral programme resources (financial, administrative and other assets), verifying compliance with approved allocations, goals, regulations/procedures, donor commitments, standards of accountability and integrity.
- Prepare regular and mandated sectoral programme/project reports for management, donors and partners to keep them informed of programme progress.

3. Technical and operational support to programme implementation

- Support implementing partners in programme planning in alignment with UNICEF's goals and objectives;
 complying with organizational processes and management systems.
- Conduct programme field visits in accordance with office procedures and exchange information with partners and stakeholders to assess progress and provide technical support. Take appropriate action to resolve issues and/or refer to relevant colleagues for resolution. Report on critical issues, bottlenecks and potential problems for timely action to achieve results.
- Provide technical and operational support to government counterparts, NGO partners, UN system
 partners, and other country office partners/donors on the application and understanding of UNICEF
 policies, strategies, processes, and best practices on nutrition-related issues to support programme
 implementation, operations and delivery of results
- Build and sustain effective close working partnerships with nutrition sector government counterparts and
 national stakeholders through active sharing of information and knowledge to facilitate programme
 implementation and build capacity of stakeholders to achieve programme goals on maternal and child
 rights as well as adolescent health ensuring keen attention to issues around equity.
